






About Wolfe Bowart

Director, Writer, and Production Design



Wolfe Bowart (Writer, Director, Production Design, SonRee) is a physical theatre creator and performer. Onstage, he inhabits a world where mops sneeze, storks swoop in bearing gifts, and trees grow out shoes. With his signature mix of circus, theatre, stage illusion, puppetry, interactive film, and physical comedy, Wolfe has enchanted audiences of all ages and nationalities.

Under the banner of his theatre company SpoonTree Productions, Wolfe has created and performed The Shneedles, LaLaLuna, Letter's End, The Man the Sea Saw, and Cloud Soup for audiences in 25 countries.

In Australia, Wolfe has been recognized by the Australia Council for the Arts and awarded grants to facilitate extensive national tours along with education programs for over 30,000 students. Wolfe's tour of Letter's End remains one of the largest Australian tours in recent years, drawing capacity houses in remote mining towns, rural areas and capital cities alike. He is a two-time Helpmann Award nominee, the Australian equivalent of the Tony Awards, achieving nods for Best National Touring Production and Best Visual/Physical Theatre Production. Wolfe has headlined at dozens of festivals around the world, including the Melbourne International Comedy Festival, the Brighton Festival and the London International Mime Festival.

Alongside his performance work, Bowart has brought theatre to the classroom as an educator, director, artist in residence and mentor to students aged 4 to 74. He has taught in association with The Los Angeles Music Center, Wolf Trap ArtStart, the California Migrant Education Program, The Ahmanson Theater, The South Coast Repertory Theater, The Playwrights Project, The Virginia Avenue Project, the National Institute of Circus Arts, the Australia Council for the Arts, and the University of Arizona. Wolfe is an Artistic Associate at The Scoundrel and Scamp Theatre where he was previously commissioned to create the magical physical theatre productions Cloud Soup and OAF (with Matt Walley).

Director's Notes

I grew up watching the silent films of Charlie Chaplin and Buster Keaton projected on a super eight projector. Later I found Jacques Tati and was comforted by the simple town in Monsieur Hulot's Holiday. One Twig at a Time is a nod to these film comedians and at times feels more like cinema than a stage play.


It is a silent poem, a series of visual micro-stories that mean whatever they mean at the time to whoever is watching. Like a nest built with twigs and leaves and bits of fluff and string, the layers of stories come together around a community of characters. Some stories are pulled from the pages of old Moleskin notebooks that I've doodled and scribbled in over the years. Most of the piece is made up of ideas and images that hadn't found a home in earlier productions while a few of the others might be recognized from earlier productions - The Shneedles, LaLaLuna, The Man the Sea Saw and Letter's End.

One Twig at a Time began with a title and an idea, and then was scripted over the past year for this particular group of Tucson actors. We had 28 days to rehearse and flesh out the images with input from the actors and the Scoundrel and Scamp family.

For the past 20 years I've toured my solo productions. The shows were shipped around the world to 22 countries in wooden packing crates. This set, masterfully built by Matthew Berta and painted by my incredible brother Wythe Bowart, was built from those crates. If you look backstage, you'll see the addresses of theaters in Malaysia, Brazil, France, Hong Kong and Australia.

As artists we ask ourselves not to get too comfortable, to take risks with our work. With One Twig at a Time, we've taken a risk, yet the story is as comforting and familiar as that Tati film I discovered years ago.




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DESIGN & PRODUCTION

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
